# Horizon 2020

## *The COM proposal*

---

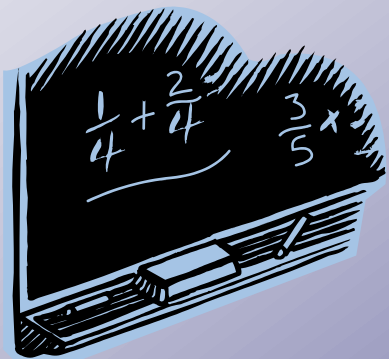
- €80 billion for 2014-2020; mainly collaborative, transnational R&D&I projects
- 3 pillars:
  - Excellent science (ERC, Marie Curie, research infra): € 25 billion
  - Industrial leadership (key technologies, access to fin, SMEs) : € 18 billion
  - Grand challenges (health, climate, energy, mobility, bio): € 32 billion
- Also includes EIT and old CIP instruments

## *The internal process*

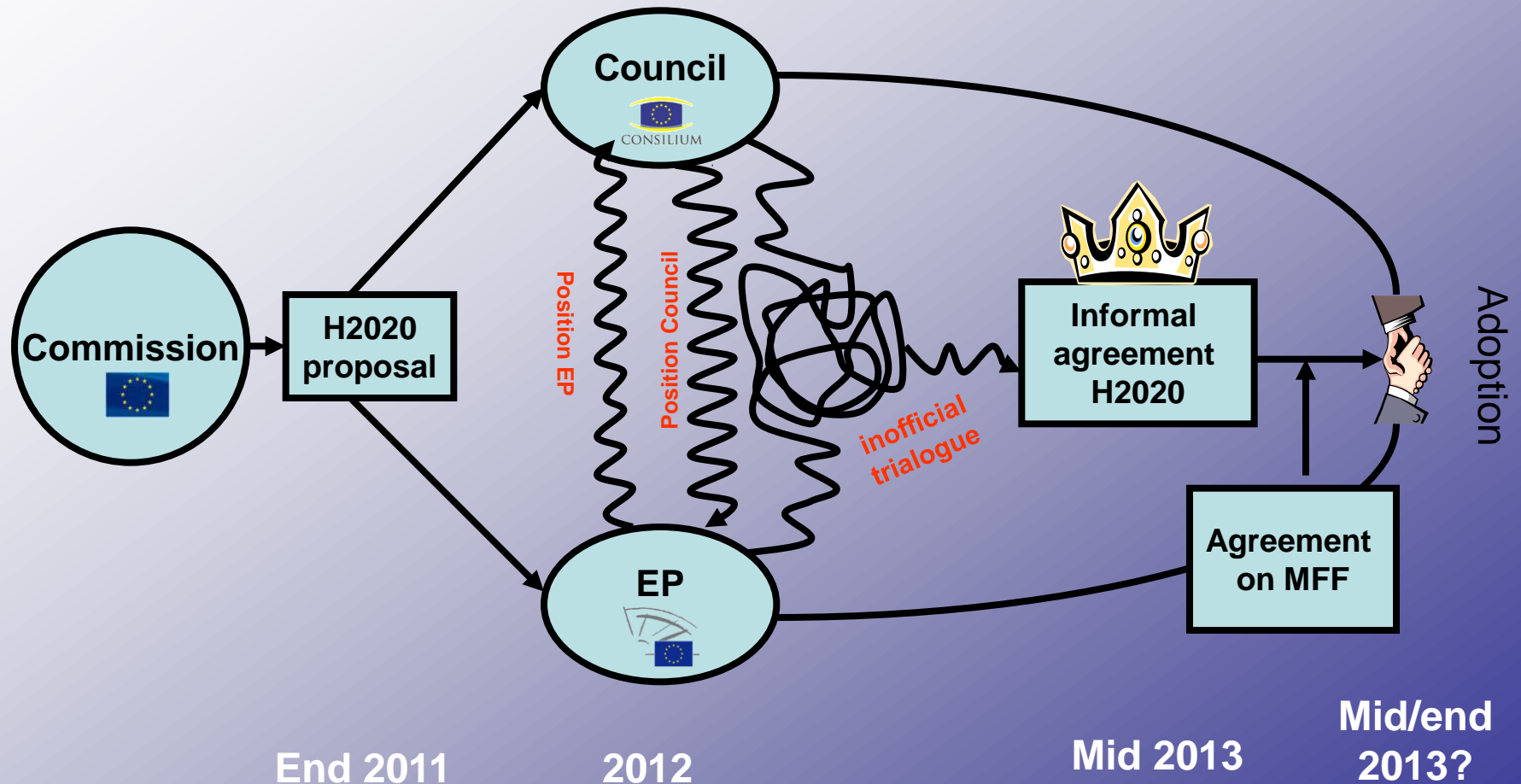
- 6 files, interlinked

## *Issues for European Parliament (1)*

---

- Synergies with Structural Funds (stairway to excellence)
- Balance (fundamental vs applied, bottom-up vs top-down, small vs big) + implementation
- Involvement industry/SMEs
- Uptake of R&D results
- PPPs/JTIs
- Ethical issues (stem-cell, defence)

## *Issues for European Parliament (2)*

---

- Funding rates (+indirect costs)
- Interpretation of rules
- IPR
- More trust, less control
- Externalisation
